

## On how to run a Church Council Meeting

My dear nephew Darren,

Clearly, the sight of your vicar running out of the room halfway through your last church council meeting, saying he should have stayed as a traffic warden, where he was universally liked, has unnerved you. It would have unnerved me too, since a universally popular traffic warden is an exceptional creature.

But perhaps it is necessary to give you some advice for the day when you do have to chair your first church council meeting.

Consider every agenda issue carefully beforehand and decide what you would like to do. Then, at the meeting, consult widely, listen to every opinion, weigh all the arguments, and then do precisely what you had decided before the meeting ever took place.







## 25th March : Lady Day or the Annunciation



This beautiful event (Luke 1:26-38) took place in Nazareth, when Mary is already betrothed to Joseph. The Archangel Gabriel comes to Mary, greets her as highly favoured, tells her not to be afraid, that she will bear a son Jesus, and that her elderly cousin Elizabeth is already pregnant (with John the Baptist).

The church calendar is never quite as neat as some would like it. To celebrate the Annunciation on 25th March does indeed place the conception of Jesus exactly nine months from His birth on 25th December, but the latter part of March almost inevitably falls during Lent. But the birth and death of Jesus are intrinsically linked - He was born to die, and thus fulfil God's purposes.

The Annunciation is a significant date in the Christian calendar – it is one of the most frequent depicted in Christian art. Gabriel's gracious strength and Mary's humble dignity have inspired many artists. Certainly, Mary's response to the angel has for centuries been an example of good faith in practice – humility, enquiry of God, and trusting acceptance in His will for her life.



## 29th March - 5th April : Palm Sunday & Holy Week

The events of Easter took place over a week, traditionally called Passion Week which began on Palm Sunday.

After all His teaching and healing, Jesus had built a following.

On the Sunday before He was to die, Jesus and His followers arrived at Jerusalem. The city was crowded. Jewish people were arriving from to celebrate Passover. This commemorates how they had escaped from slavery in Egypt nearly 1,500 year earlier. Jesus rode into the city on a young donkey. He was greeted like a conquering hero. Cheering crowds waved palm branches in tribute. He was hailed as the Messiah who had come to re-establish a Jewish kingdom.



The next day they returned to Jerusalem. Jesus went to the temple, the epicentre of the Jewish faith, and confronted the money-changers and merchants who were ripping off the people. He overturned their tables and accused them of being thieves. The religious authorities were alarmed and feared how He was stirring up the crowds.

On the Tuesday, they challenged Jesus, questioning His authority. He answered by challenging and condemning their hypocrisy. Later that day Jesus spoke to His disciples about future times. He warned them about fake religious leaders; the coming destruction of Jerusalem; wars, earthquakes and famines; and how His followers would face persecution.


By midweek the Jewish religious leaders and elders were so angry with Jesus that they began plotting to arrest and kill Him. One of Jesus' disciples, Judas, went to the chief priests and agreed to betray Him to them.

Jesus and the 12 disciples gathered on the Thursday evening to celebrate the Passover meal. This is known as the Last Supper. During the evening, Jesus initiated a ritual still marked by Christians – Holy Communion – which commemorates His death. Jesus broke bread and shared it and a cup of wine with His disciples.

Judas then left to meet the other plotters. Jesus continued to teach the others and then went outside into an olive grove to pray. He even prayed for all future believers. He agonised over what was to come but chose the way of obedience. The Bible book, Luke, records Him praying, 'Father if you are willing, take this cup from me; yet not my will but yours be done'. Minutes later Judas arrived with soldiers and the chief priests and Jesus was arrested.

*Robert Louis Stevenson was born in Edinburgh on 13 November 1850, into a family of lighthouse engineers. Despite making an attempt at studying engineering, and then studying and qualifying as a lawyer, by the time he was in his early twenties it was apparent to Stevenson himself, and eventually to his parents, that to be a writer was his calling. The ill-health that had dogged him from his earliest childhood had provided him with the space and time in which his imagination could flourish; it also gave him the constant companionship of his nurse, Alison Cunningham, who fed him a diet of Bible stories and Covenanting history, as well as tuning his young ear to a rich variety of the Scots language.*

*Although his travels in search of a climate conducive to better health kept him away from Scotland, much of the fiction he was developing in the 1880s reflected his deep interest in his native land. The conflicting currents of the country's history, and its perceived dualism of national character are reflected in *Dr Jekyll and Mr Hyde*, and in the relationship between the two very different heroes of *Kidnapped*. (Both books were published in 1886.)*

*Most famous for his novels, Stevenson was also a poet. He is probably best known for *A Child's Garden of Verses*, but he also wrote much lyric poetry, and a range of lively verse in Scots. It was in his poetry that Stevenson most effectively expressed the pain of his separation from Scotland.*

## PEAT'S SHOP AND BILLY BUCK'S



This is Worksop Road, Swallownest, near the junction with Mansfield Road, known locally as Millstone Hill. The shop on the left with the battlements was owned by Edwin Peat. It was a ladies and gents outfitters, also selling household linens, wool and haberdashery.

In Aston Parish Church Magazine in 1925, Mr. Peat was advertising his wares as: “Cash Draper, Gent’s Outfitter, General and Fancy Drapery in great variety. Goods laid by. Weekly payments. Tea Rooms – Refreshments and Afternoon Teas at this Establishment at Reasonable Charge”.

Between this shop and Mr William Buck’s shop on the right was an archway leading into a back yard and a garage workshop. Mr Buck’s shop had two large windows, as can be seen in the photo on the right.

He advertised in the same parish magazine as Mr Peat.

“W Buck, 7 Worksop Road, Swallownest, General and Cycle Dealer. Repairs to Cars, Cycles, etc. Agent for Raleigh Cycle Co. Ltd. Old Cycles in part exchange. Taxis for Hire. Gramophones. Records. Petrol.”

He also advertised in the Parish Church Magazine in 1945, the same advert with the addition of “Coal Dealer”.



Just in front of the shop windows stood two Esso petrol pumps. Cars pulled up beside the kerb edge and the petrol delivery pipe swung out over the pavement on an overhead arm. The attendant inserted the nozzle into the tank and manually pumped the petrol through. Pedestrians simply walked along the pavement underneath the overhead arm.


Billy Buck was quite a character, always in shirt sleeves and always smoking. His shop was filled with everything needed for a car, a motorbike or a bicycle and very often you had to wait whilst he tried to remember where he had put the part you needed.

One of his two windows was always kept to display bicycles. I remember my Raleigh bike came from here in the 1950s.

Buck's shop was demolished and the adjoining terraced house incorporated in the Swallownest Inn. The site of Billy's shop and workshop became the car park for the Inn. Peat's shop was divided into two shops and over the years, they have been occupied by many and varied businesses, including M & B Fashions, Fancy Goods, Children's Clothes, Tattoo Parlour, Sandwich Shop, Vape Shop, Nail Bar etc.

We believe the photographs were taken late 1930s or early 1940s.


