On dealing with Summer Fetes

My dear nephew Darren,

So, you are beginning to plan your first Summer Fete in your new parish. That you appear to be looking forward to it shows how little you know about them.

Parishes hold Summer Fetes so that their clergy can preach more meaningfully on purgatory. Their ostensible purpose is to raise money for the church - which is wholly illogical. The parish could double the money raised if the Fete were dropped, none of the endless preparations made, if everyone spent a pleasant afternoon in their own gardens and each person simply donated £20 to the church instead. But we still feel obliged to go to endless trouble, making ourselves miserable so we can show each other what a good time we are having. That it generally pours seems to make the entire event even more grimly satisfying.

No, the real reasons for a Summer Fete are twofold. First, it gives the entire parish the chance to inspect the Rector's garden. Whatever state it is in, it will cause disapproval. If it is poorly kept, then I am clearly being ungrateful for having three acres of lawn to enjoy. Mowing it each week should be one of my delights; what else would I do with a whole day off each week anyway? The hand mower, kindly given by Colonel French is assumed to be quite adequate - and rumour has it that I need to lose weight anyway. The mower was presented to me when the Colonel bought his own gardener a sit-on motor mower - which is of a size and opulence that makes me assume it has a drinks cabinet and satellite navigation.

The second reason for a Fete comes as a special perk for the organisers. It gives them a chance to inspect the inside of the Rectory. Under the pretence of looking for a little more sugar, they can systematically inspect all the kitchen cupboards and comment on their contents. By the end of the day, the whole parish will know what marmalade I spread on my toast, that I use unnecessarily expensive washing powder, and where I have unsuccessfully tried to hide the gin.

The details of what then happens while the Fete is in progress must wait until my next letter, when we will have had our own. It is now time for Evensong, drinks with Major Mallet and his wife, and then a quiet evening with a good book, while I toy with other possible hiding places for the gin this year.

2nd May : Athanasius, theologian who gave us the Nicene Creed



This is the name behind the Athanasian Creed. Athanasius (296-373) was born into a prosperous family in Alexandria in Egypt, studied in the Christian school there and entered the ministry. He was twenty-nine years old when he accompanied Alexander, the bishop of Alexandria, to the Church's first ecumenical Council, at Nicaea in 325. Although Athanasius could not take part in the Council's debates because he was a deacon and not a bishop, Alexander consulted him on the meaning of biblical texts and theological distinctions. With Emperor Constantine sitting as President, 300 bishops argued about the Person of Christ. How is He the Son of God? Is He God or man or both together? Did He exist before He was born? If we worship Him, does that mean that we are worshipping two Gods?

The young Athanasius saw that some bishops wanted to impose the teaching of Arius on the Church. Arius was a popular preacher in Alexandria who taught that Christ was not eternal but was a 'Saviour' created by the Father. Athanasius worked with his bishop, Alexander, in framing what became known as the Nicene Creed. Our Lord's full divinity was safeguarded in the words, 'eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, light from light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one substance with the Father.'

When Bishop Alexander died in 328, Athanasius succeeded him as Bishop by popular demand. For the next 45 years Athanasius' devotion, scholarship, and forceful leadership established the Nicene Creed in the Christian Church. His enemies, both in Church and state, conspired against him, and he was exiled five times from the See of Alexandria and spent a total of 17 years in flight and hiding. It was his uncompromising stand for Nicene theology that gave rise to the familiar saying, Athanasius contra mundum, 'Athanasius against the world.'

Athanasius' name will always be linked with the triumph of New Testament Christology over every form of reductionism. Of his many writings the most significant was his great study on the person and work of Christ; 'On the Incarnation of the Word of God', written before he was 30 years old. The whole Church of Christ is always in need of bishops, leaders and theologians in the mould of Athanasius.



24th May : Day of Pentecost, Whit Sunday



Pentecost took place on the well-established Jewish festival of Firstfruits, which was observed at the beginning of the wheat harvest. It was seven weeks after Easter, or 50 days including Easter.

A feast day to celebrate the country's wheat harvest does not sound exactly world-changing, but that year, it became one of the most important days in world history. For Pentecost was the day that Jesus sent the Holy Spirit – the day the Church was born.

Jesus had told His disciples that something big was going to happen, and that they were to wait for it in Jerusalem, instead of returning to Galilee. Jesus had plans for His disciples, but He knew they could not do the work themselves. They would need His help.

And so, they waited in Jerusalem, praying together with His other followers, for many days. And then on that fateful morning there was suddenly the sound as of a mighty rushing wind. Tongues of flame flickered on their heads, and they began to praise God in many tongues, to the astonishment of those who heard them. The curse of Babel (Genesis 11: 1-9) was dramatically reversed that morning.

That morning the Holy Spirit came to indwell the disciples and followers of Jesus. The Church was born. The Christians were suddenly full of life and power, utterly different from their former fearful selves. The change in them was permanent.

Peter gave the first ever sermon of the Christian Church that morning, proclaiming Jesus was the Messiah. His boldness in the face of possible death was in marked contrast to the man who had denied Jesus 50 days before. And 3,000 people responded, were converted, and were baptised. How's that for fast church growth!

Of course, Pentecost was not the first time the Holy Spirit had acted in this world. All through the Old Testament there are accounts of how God's Spirit guided people and strengthened them. But now, because of Christ's death and resurrection, He could INDWELL them. From now on, every Christian could have the confidence that Jesus was with them constantly, through the indwelling of His Holy Spirit.

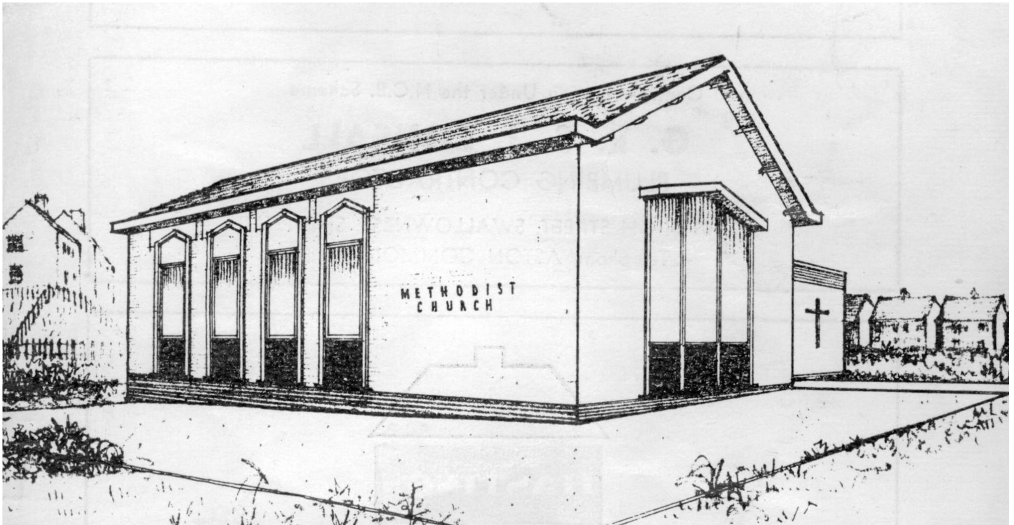

METHODIST CHURCH ON WESLEY AVENUE



Methodist Church on Wesley Avenue

In the South Yorkshire Times and Mexborough & Swinton Times on Saturday 26 May 1962 it was reported that on one of the new housing estates in the Aughton and Swallownest area, a new Methodist Church is striking a distinctly modern note. Provision is being made for material as well as spiritual needs. A lounge where men may rest and enjoy a cup of tea will form part of the premises. How far this will be used by working men during their lunch breaks I do not know, but the idea is a good one and takes us back to one of the earliest functions of the Church which was to provide shelter, food and rest for the traveller.

Later that year, on the 24th November, the Rotherham Advertiser reported that permission had been granted for the building of a new Methodist Church at Aston. Work on a church hall, kitchen and toilets, the first stages in the programme, should be completed by late next Autumn, at a cost of £7,000.

The Rotherham Rural District Council had given approval to an outline application by the Rotherham Methodist Circuit for a church to be built at Wesley Avenue, Swallownest. This project was part of the transfer of the Methodist Chapel at Aughton, which was sold early that year to the All Saints' Church Council, when the Rotherham Methodist Circuit decided to find a new "home" for their church.

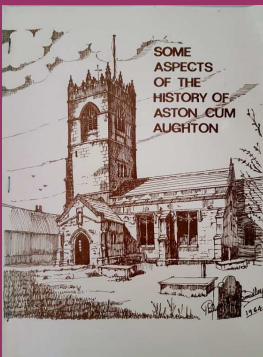


The new church was sited at the junction of Wesley Avenue and Alexandra Road and with new housing estates being built in the area, the Rev D A Griffiths, Superintendent of the Rotherham Methodist Circuit, said the church would serve a growing need.

Mr. Griffiths told the Advertiser that at first the circuit had thought of erecting a temporary building, but had changed their ideas on this point and found it would be cheaper to erect a permanent building. Mr Griffiths said "We have plans to build a church hall, kitchen and toilets first so we can start Sunday School and similar work. I hope that work will start by late next Summer and that this work, including furnishing, will be completed by late Autumn." Mr Griffiths said he did not know how much the site was going to cost and a lot depended on how long planning arrangements took before work could be started.

The Rotherham Rural District Council granted permission subject to a number of conditions, one of which was that no development should take place without the prior written approval of the local planning authority to the siting, design and external appearance of the building. It was demolished in the 1980s and houses were built on the site.

31st May : Trinity Sunday celebrating our God who is Three Persons



Trying to explain the doctrine of the Trinity has kept many a theologian busy down the centuries. One helpful picture is to imagine the sun shining in the sky. The sun itself – way out there in space, and unapproachable in its fiery majesty - is **the Father**. The light that flows from it, which gives us life and illuminates all our lives, is **the Son**. The heat that flows from it, and which gives us all the energy to move and grow, is **the Holy Spirit**. You cannot have the sun without its light and its heat. The light and the heat are from the sun, are of the sun, and yet are also distinct in themselves, with their own roles to play.

The Bible makes clear that God is One God, who is disclosed in three persons: Father, Son (Jesus Christ) and Holy Spirit. For example:

Deuteronomy 6:4: *'Hear O Israel, The Lord our God, the Lord is one.'*

Isaiah 45:22: *'Turn to me and be saved... for I am God, and there is no other.'*

Genesis 1:1-2: *'In the beginning God created.... and the Spirit of God was hovering...'*

Judges 14:6: *'The Spirit of the Lord came upon him in power...'*

John 1:1-3: *'In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. He was with God in the beginning. Through Him all things were made; without Him nothing was made that has been made.'*

Luke 24:49 actually manages to squeeze the whole Trinity into one sentence. Jesus tells His disciples: *'I am going to send you what my Father has promised; but stay in the city until you have been clothed with power (the Holy Spirit) from on high.'*

In other words, the sun eternally gives off light and heat, and whenever we turn to its brilliant light, we find that the warmth and life there as well.



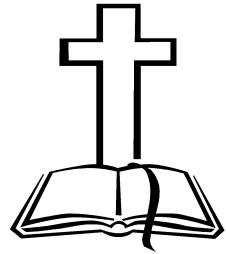
